GROUND REGULATIONS

All persons entering the Stadium on match days are only admitted subject to these rules and regulations:

- 1) The Club reserves the right to eject from the ground and prosecute, if thought appropriate, any person within the clubs premises who is considered in breach of the following: **a)** Entering the ground by any means other than through the proper turnstiles or gates. **b)** Entering the field of play before, during or after the game. **c)** Using obscene or abusive language or persistent swearing likely to cause offence. **d)** Using terms of abuse, racial or otherwise, that is likely to offend. **e)** Being drunk or being under the influence of drugs. **f)** Making vulgar or obscene gestures. **g)** Carrying any offensive object or throwing any article onto the field of play.
- 2) The Club reserves the right to refuse admission or eject from the ground any person who refuses to be searched by any servant or agent of the club or any Police Officer.
- 3) No glass bottles, drinking glasses or other such article or object is permitted in the ground and the Club Officials / Stewards will have the right to seize or confiscate any item or article considered to be a danger to others.
- 4) Climbing of the fences, stands and other structures including sitting on the barriers around the pitch is not permitted.
- 5) All vehicles are parked at the owner's risk.
- 6) Only players, officials and club personnel may enter the changing room area.

WHERE else in the world do players in the ninth and tenth tiers get the chance to play at the country's national stadium?

That's actually a genuine question as I'd be intrigued to know but the FA Vase has always felt totally unique.

Last weekend the long road to Wembley begins for clubs in both the Isuzu FA Vase and Non-League's other premier cup competition, the Isuzu FA Trophy.

The Vase has always had a place in my Non-League heart. I've never seen my team win it, but it was the first ever trip to Wembley – a 4-4 thriller between Guiseley and Gresley Rovers back in 1991.

Those were the days of finals going to replays and Guiseley eventually ran out winners at Bramall Lane.

But that was the first taste of the competition and since then I've been lucky to see finals won by Diss Town, Tiverton Town (twice) the years away from Wembley where AFC Sudbury were unfortunate to be beaten three years in a row by Brigg Town, Winchester City and Didcot Town, before much later joining The NLP to cover it as a 'job'.

From Whitley Bay's all-conquering side as part of the Northern League's dominant years to Romford lifting the 50th edition last season, it's a competition that throws up wonderful stories every year.

If you haven't checked out Phil Annetts' @favasefactfile page on X – formerly Twitter – then I highly recommend you do. It's packed with stats and facts about the famous competition first won in 1975 by Hoddesdon Town.

In total 595 teams will enter the competition this year. By the end of the first round qualifying, 187 will be one step closer. Only eight more rounds to go before the final in May!

Thanks to Phil's stats we knew there were 51 Step 6 clubs guaranteed of progression with 44 all Step 5 ties. There are 92 ties with the chance of an upset.

The competition shows the vast depth of football in this country. Just think how many players will be representing their club in the Vase this weekend,

with more to join as the early rounds continue.

Ultimately, in nine months' time, two sides will battle it out on the hallowed turf at Wembley. Now that is special.

Jonathan 'JJ' Lacey enjoyed a day to remember at Wembley Stadium back in May.

The Biggleswade Town midfielder and his family were handed the VIP treatment at the Home of Football as a special guest of The FA at the **FA Cup Final**.

This once-in-a-lifetime opportunity was JJ's reward for ranking as the highest scorer in the competition, from the Extra Preliminary Round to the Final, after his 10 goals helped the Southern League Premier Central Waders win through six rounds before being knocked out by Solihull Moors in the fourth qualifying round.

Only Manchester City goal machine Erling Haaland could have possibly topped Lacey's goal haul ahead of his team's 2-1 loss to Manchester United - but would have needed to have scored six goals.

Lacey's day included carrying out the match ball prior to kick-off and being presented with the Golden Ball Award by former Manchester United striker Dion Dublin.

"It's once-in-a-lifetime stuff, to be able to walk the match ball out before kick-off, and to be presented this award, it's amazing for me and my family," he said.

"It's surreal to be the top scorer in the Emirates FA Cup, and invite my family to enjoy the Final at Wembley Stadium and see me receive the trophy.

"We wondered if it all might be too good to be true, so when it became official after the final whistle we were relieved, and now I'm really proud to take home the Golden Ball Award."

Lacey, 25, was pushed all the way by Ramsgate striker Joe Taylor, who notched nine goals for

the Rams in a remarkable season tally of 53 for the Isthmian South East side.

And he said he was only unaware of the award in September, when he scored a hat-trick in an away tie with then Step 2 side Bishop's Stortford

The FA's Director of Pro Game Relations, Andy Ambler, added: "JJ Lacey is an excellent example of this competition giving players and clubs across the English pyramid the chance to test themselves against the very elite.

"His goal-scoring exploits from attacking midfield were outstanding, and we are delighted that his family could attend today's Final and see him collect the Golden Ball Award."

This year, a record high 221 fixtures took place in the FA Cup extra preliminary round – and the competition kicked off in celebratory fashion after a new record was set for the earliest date and time that a goal has been scored in FA Cup history.



It came on Friday August 2nd, at 7.54pm, when Jack Hobson-McVeigh netted for hosts Royal Wootton Bassett Town in their 2-1 extra preliminary round tie against Mangotsfield United.

At precisely the same time, Louie Duffield scored for Great Yarmouth Town who knocked out visitors Kirkley & Pakefield 2-0.

Both players now jointly hold that prestigious accolade.

The red-carpet treatment enjoyed by Lacey, the former Berkhamsted and Hemel Hempstead Town player, will undoubtedly inspire goal-getters to shine in these early rounds.

The 2024-25 season may only be a month old but the FA Cup preliminary round winners already are already setting their sights on launching a glory run.

One man who has already made a mark is Tilbury's Sam Bantick, who completed a memorable hat-trick in the Dockers' 4-1 extra preliminary round win over Buckhurst Hill with a wondergoal from inside in own half!

The Isthmian North returnees then beat Stanway Rovers 3-1 in their preliminary round clash but Bantick had to settle for watching others make their mark.

Traditionally, the term 'magic of the FA Cup' is usually saved for the first round proper onwards as Non-League sides lock horns with the elite.

But try telling that to the thousands of hopefuls wearing their hearts on the sleeves this season.

LEISTON FC U23s

Leiston Town Football Club was first affiliated with the Suffolk County FA in 1880 and at the time was closely associated with the Richard Garrett Engineering Works in Leiston.

The club's early years were spent in the North Suffolk League or Ipswich and District League. Leiston Town were 'Full Members' of the Football Association from the early 1950's until 1982 following their relegation from the Senior Division (the only other Suffolk teams at this time were Ipswich Town and Lowestoft Town) and soon after this period the club dropped the Town part to become just Leiston FC.

During this period Leiston were accepted and played in the FA Cup, FA Amateur Cup and later the FA Vase. The clubs Youth team were the first club in Suffolk to enter the FA Youth Challenge Cup reaching the First Round and a trip to Highbury to face Arsenal in 1954 where they took an early lead before losing 8-1 to the Gunners.

In May the club regained its Full Member status of the FA, one of only four Suffolk clubs to hold this.

Season 2008/2009 will be long remembered in the history of Leiston as we became only one of three sides to ever reach the First Round proper of the FA Cup after starting the competition at the Extra Preliminary Round stage. Memorable wins at higher ranked Carshalton Athletic and Conference Premier Lewes in a run that lasted nine games and ended in a replay defeat at Conference North Fleetwood Town in front of 2000 fans after a record crowd of 1250 had watched the First Round goal less draw at Victory Road.

After ten seasons in the Eastern Counties League the club gained promotion to the Ryman League as champions of the Ridgeons League. The inaugural Ryman League season provided unexpected success and at the first attempt secured the Division One North title with some fantastic performances including a 26 game unbeaten run.

In 2017-18 the club achieved its highest ever league position, 5th in the Ryman premier division under Glen Driver. They have continued to compete in step 3 football, albeit in a different league for the past two seasons.

A very youthful Reserve side has played some great football over the past couple of seasons and has seen several young players push into first team squads.

Another recent addition is our third senior squad; our "A" team. Set up to help u18 players transition into senior football, this side gained promotion in the first season of the SIL into division 3 where they will play in the 2020-21 season.

The club continues to engage youth development and the U18's had a fine season especially in the cup competitions and continues to progress while the introduction and links with Junior sides in the community will see the club evolve further for the future.

Over the years, Leiston have been blessed with many

able and willing Chairmen, Secretaries and committee members and the club has prides itself on its family attitudes.

The club has also been very fortunate over the years to have players of note in their ranks and includes many links with professional clubs including Ian Gillespie, Ted Phillips, Jackie Warne, Stuart Boardley, Byron Lawrence, and Jason Dozell to name but a few.

This has been added to in recent months by the appointment of Darren Eadie as joint manager with Chris Wigger. The 2020-21 season is looked forward to in much

anticipation under their joint stewardship.

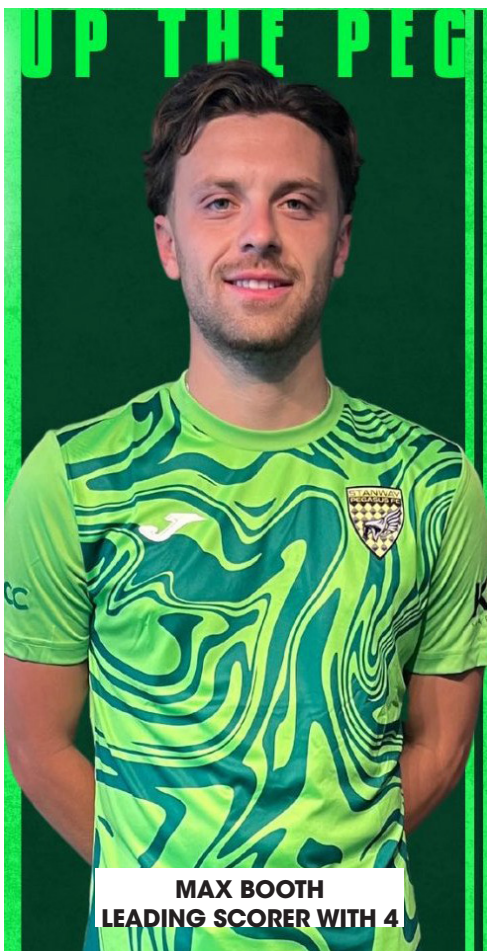
The club continues to improve its facilities in line with FA grading requirements and now has some of the best Non League facilities in Suffolk and the club is forever looking to improve.

Recently the club gained FA Charter standard and regained full FA Membership, one of only 4 in Suffolk. The efforts of Chairman Andy Crisp and Vice Chairman Peter Mayhew have been the main driving factors behind the changes and the meteoric rise of the club to step three of the national pyramid.

Stanway Pegasus Football Club was derived from the most successful Sunday League side in Colchester history, AFC Pegasus, who won an incredible 64 honours over a period of 30 years with Paul and Heather Booth at the helm for every one of them.

AFC Pegasus in turn was created from Pegasus Youth in 1985 who had a great history in the Colchester Youth League for many years dating back to the early 1970's with the founder being Mr Peter Peters.

When Paul and Heather stepped aside a new era was about to begin and the transition from Sunday League to Saturday football for the senior team in 2018 opened the door for the return of the youth set up at the club.

With passion and drive to succeed than ever before, both off and off the pitch, we were ready to start that new era. With various youth and men's teams in full swing, our vision is to be one of the biggest clubs in Essex that has men's teams competing at a high level of non-league football who lead the way for the youth set-up. This youth set-up will progress through their age groups starting at U6's, all the way through to U18's.

This is what we call 'The Pathway'. Although player development is a key aspect of our philosophy, the aim for the youth is to enjoy playing football for Stanway Pegasus and looking at the talented home grown youth squads we have, boys and girls the future is looking very good under the guidance of our Head of Youth Ray Turner (Pictured).

The Club prides itself hugely on former and current players plus youth managers taking



up major roles within the Club whilst surrounding ourselves with people we trust.

Soon to be added to the Pegasus family were the women, girls and recently the Vets as the club proudly sits at over 30 teams have been the fastest growing Club in the area and success is no stranger with many league titles and promotions along with cup success the Club is blossoming into a huge success story and long may it continue.

Senior football for the men's first team was secured for the first time at the end of the 2021 /22 season with the team gaining promotion from Essex and Suffolk Border Premier League where they went unbeaten winning the league with 98 points from 34 games scoring 126 goals in the process.

They also beat Tiptree Heath 1-0 in the League Cup Final at Little Oakley. Max Booth was the Division's top goal scorer with 34 (26 league and 8 Cup)

2022/23 Season saw the team in the Eastern Counties Division One South where we narrowly lost out on promotion at the first attempt via a penalty

shoot out after a 2-2 draw against Sporting Bengal.

The ladies have been just as successful in a short period of time with winning the Essex County Woman's Premier League piping by 2 points local rivals Stanway Rovers to seal back to back promotions that now see them competing in the Eastern Region League for the first time as the club looks to push on in all fronts.

A Ladies reserve team was started up and joined the Essex County Woman's League Division 3.

The club also entered the FA Vase for the first time playing six matches beating Haverhill Borough, Takeley, Halstead Town, Barkingside and London Lions before falling to Romford in the 4th Round proper.

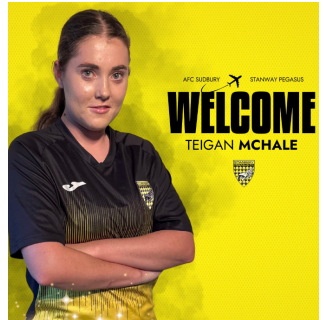
